





## What Is PBL?


In Project Based Learning, teachers make learning come alive for students. Students work on a project over an extended period of time – [from a month to a semester] – that engages them in solving a real-world problem or answering a complex question. They demonstrate their knowledge and skills by creating a public product or presentation for a real audience.

As a result, students develop deep content knowledge as well as critical thinking, collaboration, creativity, and communication skills. Project Based Learning unleashes a contagious, creative energy among students and teachers.

## The Gold Standard for High-Quality PBL

To help ensure your students are getting the main course and are engaging in quality Project Based Learning, PBLWorks promotes a research-based model for “Gold Standard PBL.” The Gold Standard PBL model encompasses two useful guides for educators:

1. Seven Essential Project Design Elements provide a framework for developing high quality projects for your classroom, and
2. Seven Project Based Teaching Practices help teachers, schools, and organizations measure, calibrate, and improve their practice.

## How Does PBL Differ from “Doing a Project”?

PBL is becoming widely used in schools and other educational settings, with different varieties being practiced. However, there are key characteristics that differentiate “doing a project” from engaging in rigorous Project Based Learning.

We find it helpful to distinguish a “dessert project” - a short, intellectually-light project served up after the teacher covers the content of a unit in the usual way - from a “main course” project, in which the project is the unit. In Project Based Learning, the project is the vehicle for teaching the important knowledge and skills student need to learn. The project contains and frames curriculum and instruction.

In contrast to dessert projects, PBL requires critical thinking, problem solving, collaboration, and various forms of communication. To answer a Driving Question and create high-quality work, students need to do much more than remember information. They need to use higher-order thinking skills and learn to work as a team.


## Top 10 Reasons Why Clariden Excels at PBL

1. Clariden follows the **Buck Institute's Gold Standard** when developing and implementing our projects.
2. Projects are developed to meet and exceed Texas State Standards as well as meet all elements of the required Gold Standard for PBL.
3. Projects span a length of time (4-12 weeks). This allows for a greater level of understanding – mastery of concepts and an in-depth understanding of how concepts apply to real world problems.
4. Clariden's projects are enhanced by field study and travel.
5. Clariden's projects are designed to allow for creativity, collaboration and for students to have choice and ownership of their learning.
6. Clariden's learning environment is designed to promote student voice. Students learn to use their voice to state what they know, what they've learned and how to present in a manner that reflects their knowledge of content and concepts and their ability to problem solve.
7. Clariden students gain knowledge from experts and mentors.
8. Project work is integrated with concepts learned in content time. This reinforces learning and allows for further exploration.
9. Clariden designs projects that challenge students to think about and create items that they may have previously had no experience with. For example: rockets, robots, the rain forest, rovers, Texas ecosystems, roller coasters, hatching of baby chicks, etc.
10. Clariden students are actively engaged in their learning and are happy to be at school and most importantly – happy and eager to learn.

# Programs

## A Whole-Student Program

The Clariden School helps students find their voice, develop it and challenge it. Knowing one's own voice helps a student advocate for their educational and personal goals. The Clarden School is a safe place to explore, investigate, question, analyze, and challenge one's self. Talk with our students and this difference is immediately evident. Our students know their voice and own their education.

### Project-Based Learning

Foundational curriculum is reinforced and integrated into an overarching project. Students from ages 3 to 18 are taught to synthesize their understanding of a project through their "Presentations of Learning" (POLs) to their class and community. These projects demonstrate the relevancy and interdependency of each academic discipline. They also learn the critical thinking and teamwork skills that are required for today's workplaces.

### Personalized College Prep

Because of our small class size, we are able to provide personalized college prep plans for each student based on their goals. From guidance on testing, to references, to scholarship research, to guidance through the whole application process -- Clariden's team is there to help the student and their family make this milestone successful.

### Character Education

We have a phrase at Clariden that has become our standard greeting: "And Remember, Be Your Best Self." Teaching our students about respect and about being a good citizen within our community is a critical part of life at Clariden. It starts in our classrooms from the youngest to the oldest. It is so important to us that it's even built into each student's overall grade which we call the Cougar PRIDE grade. The code of honorable behavior is based on the acronym P.R.I.D.E.: Politeness, Respect, Integrity, (Self-) Discipline, and Embracing Opportunity.

### Hands-On Field Study

From our youngest students to our oldest, we know the importance of making education relevant. Field study enables us to provide regular, real-world experiences that take classroom lessons and show them live and in action. Our small class sizes enable us to be welcomed at unique destinations for a behind-the-scenes look and an invaluable experience.

### Expansive Curriculum

Clariden delivers a robust curriculum.

- We cover all the traditional subject areas: Reading, Writing, Math, Science, and Social Studies
- Then we go farther to include: Art & Design, Music, Presentation Skills, Computer Skills, Coding, Rocketry, Robotics
- And farther still to include: Physical Education, Health, Online Safety, Theater, Dance, Foreign Languages, In-House Crocodile Research, and more.

We consider all of these subjects to be the foundation of critical thinking and a well-rounded education.

### STEAM Focused

We take STEM to another level with our STEAM programs. In today's tech world, user interfaces are critical to the successful adoption of technology. We make sure students get the art and design skills needed to make their technical skills approachable. We also provide them with the full picture of how marketing and communications integrate into technology and vice versa. Students begin our STEAM program in Cougar Prep and continue through High School.

Our extra-curricular programs are developed based on the interests of our students. We have an award-winning Odyssey of the Mind program along with Drama club, Coding clubs, Film club and more. 

### METHODOLOGY

The Clariden School delivers a rigorous and engaging academic experience for motivated students and their families. This is achieved through the integrated approach of project-based learning. Along with an extensive foundational curriculum, Clariden's program is a series of building blocks. Our teachers collaborate across grades to ensure the core skills are introduced to our youngest students and expanded each year through coordinated curriculum. This enables our students to move through materials quickly and smoothly. We also build in prep years into our program to help students transition from one phase of their education to another. 1. **Distinguished Diploma:** Clariden's diploma is classified as "Distinguished Academic Program" level -- Texas' highest level.
2. **Honors Only:** Clariden is an "All Honors" program where 9th - 12th Grades are all honors-level courses.
3. **30% More Credits:** Students typically graduate with about 30% more credits than what is achievable in public school. Admissions officers look very favorably on this.
4. **No Class Ranking:** Means that students won't be automatically excluded from college admissions processes that reject students outside a given rank.
5. **Student Academics:** Clariden students' performance is consistently above local, state & national averages for grade level. We nurture advanced, problem-solving students.
6. **Top ACT & SAT:** Clariden students' test scores are consistently above the state and national averages.
7. **Unique Extra-Curricular:** Our experiences differentiate our students. Clariden's class size enables us to provide high-touch, high-value experiences from world travel to the use of technology, machinery and expert research.
8. **Academic Competition Leaders:** Our teams consistently deliver strong performances at top national academic competitions.
9. **Dual Credit / Concurrent Credit Courses:** Credit hours earned can never be taken away. They must be recognized by the college, unlike AP classes that may or may not be recognized by the college. College credit hours done in high school saves college tuition money and immediately advances the student in their line of study.
10. **Personalized Referrals:** Small classes mean teachers know each and every student. Teachers are able to provide highly personalized referrals that assist the student in their line of study.
11. **Well-Developed Character:** Clariden's focus on student voice and accountability is immediately apparent in all our students. The small school environment means no one is seen as a number and no one can be anonymous. Instead, our students are seen, heard and treated as citizens and leaders within our community.
12. **Private School Applications Stand Out:** College admissions officers take notice of private schools because they understand the value of a more personalized education. It provides a diversity of thought to their communities which they see as highly desirable.
